Sunday, February 20, 2022 – Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle C

MARY AND THE SAINTS WHO WILL GUIDE AND ASSIST US

We stand on the shoulders of giants. A great cloud of witnesses preceded us and are with us today. May the saints – officially recognized, as well as our ancestors who are surely with God in heaven – intercede for us. We especially call upon the following saints in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee:

- ◆ St. Michael the Archangel (Primary patron of the diocese): Defender of the faith, conqueror of the devil and protector of the faithful.
- ◆ St. Thomas More (Co-Patron of the Diocese): Married layperson, lawyer. Was passionate about defending and promoting the Catholic faith, even unto martyrdom.
- ◆ St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (Co-patron of the diocese): First citizen of the United States to be canonized and founded many schools and academies for the promotion of the Catholic faith.
- ◆ St. Thérèse of Lisieux (Patroness of missionaries): Even though she remained in the convent for most of her religious life, she had a heart for evangelization, and therefore she encouraged many through her prayer and writings.
- ◆ Servant of God Antonio Cuipa and Companions, Martyrs of La Florida: Native Americans and missionaries who embraced the faith and laid down their lives for the faith – right here in what is now our diocese. “The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church” (Tertullian, 2nd century).
- ◆ Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman (Jackson, MS): Convert to Catholicism and religious sister, dedicated to sharing the joy of the Gospel – especially with her African-American sisters and brothers. Worked for racial harmony and inspired millions to embrace the faith and live it well.
- ◆ St. Andrew Dũng-Lac and the Vietnamese Martyrs: One hundred seventeen missionaries, catechists, clerics and laypeople, who died for the faith in Vietnam.
- ◆ St. Joseph: Faithful (earthly) father for Jesus and spouse of Mary. In this, the Year of St. Joseph, we call upon this great saint to inspire us to carry the Gospel to all nations.
- ◆ Mary, the Mother of God: After receiving the news of the incarnation from the angel Gabriel, Mary went in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth and to share the good news of salvation. She followed Jesus faithfully, shared in his suffering, rejoiced in his resurrection and received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost with the Apostles. Perhaps her words at the Wedding at Cana are most appropriate for us today, “Do whatever he tells you.” (John 2:5)

Celebrating St. Eugene's Heroes and Sheroes Reflecting the pride of *people of African descent!*



Elorm Nsungwe Kobla Dzikunu was born on February 1, 2000, to Naomi Shamatutu-Dzikunu and Wellington Dzikunu. At the time of his birth, he was the baby in a household with five older children so there were plenty of hands to hold him and spoil him.

When Elorm was about a year and a half, he started doing what most little kids do, which was pulling pots and pans out of the cupboards and playing with them. What was different with him is that he would set them up like a drum set and play as if he was sitting at the drums. Initially, the family didn't think much of it until he started playing recognizable beats. It was then that the whole family realized that he had a gift.

During a church program one evening when Elorm was about three years old, he walked up to the front of the church where the drums were, sat down, and with encouragement from Father Boat, he started playing the drums. The rest, as they say, is history because he has been the church drummer ever since. He received some music education during his time at FAMU DRS (3rd grade - 8th grade), where he was the youngest member of the band when he joined and had the opportunity to play with the world-famous FAMU Marching “100” band. It was there that he got the nickname Eezy because of how easily he played the drums.

Elorm went on to high school at John Paull II Catholic High School where he took a break from music and focused on basketball and football as his extracurricular activities. Following graduation from JPPII, he has been working as a music engineer/producer, hoping to break into the music industry as a producer for mainstream artists.

Justin Fitzpatrick is a native of Tallahassee, Florida.

Justin is a product of Leon County and St. Eugene and all they have to offer.

His parents are Norris Fitzpatrick and ZsaZsa Ingram-Fitzpatrick. He has two brothers, Jalen, and Jordan Fitzpatrick.

He attended Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University, Developmental Research School from K through 12th grade. In middle school Justin took a band class and his instructor Dr. Arnett Moore introduced him to the saxophone. Justin would practice endlessly each day. His goal was not only to learn to play the instrument, but to master his skills. Justin started attending FAMU Marching “100” summer band camp each year.



He also started playing with St. Eugene's choir each Sunday. He found great pleasure in playing with Elorm Dzikunu and Noah Wise. Their musicianship formed a bond that is still very strong to this day.

Justin's musical skills opened many doors for him. It allowed him to achieve his goal of attending Florida A & M University and playing as a band member of the world-famous Marching “100” band. Justin learned to play the soprano, alto, tenor, baritone, and bass saxophone. As a freshman, Justin was a member of FAMU's Wind Symphony when they made their historic appearance at Carnegie Hall. During his senior year, Justin was selected as Band President. As a child and an adult each year, Justin attended the annual Plenty Good Room gospel workshop hosted at St. Eugene and the Rivers Institute (an African American religious music clinic) at the Lyke Conference. He enjoyed the mentorship of Kenneth W. Louis, who facilitated both workshops.

Justin has worked with numerous organizations and businesses in the areas of social media development and management, website building and multimedia creation, as well as fostering community-based collaboration through the Village at We Are All We Need (WAAWN).

MARÍA Y LOS SANTOS QUE NOS GUIARÁN Y AYUDARÁN

Estamos sobre los hombros de gigantes. Una gran nube de testigos nos precedió, y hoy nos acompaña. Que los santos oficialmente reconocidos, así como nuestros antepasados que seguramente están con Dios en el cielo, intercedan por nosotros. Invocamos especialmente a los siguientes santos en la Diócesis de Pensacola-Tallahassee:

- ◆ San Miguel Arcángel (patrono principal de la diócesis): Defensor de la fe, vencedor sobre el demonio, y protector de los fieles.
- ◆ Santo Tomás Moro (copatrono de la diócesis): Laico casado, abogado. Fue un apasionado de la defensa y la promoción de la fe católica, incluso hasta el martirio.
- ◆ Santa Isabel Ana Seton (copatrona de la diócesis): Primera ciudadana de los Estados Unidos en ser canonizada. Fundó numerosas escuelas y academias para la promoción de la fe católica.
- ◆ Santa Teresa de Lisieux (patrona de los misioneros): Aunque permaneció en el convento durante la mayor parte de su vida religiosa, tenía un corazón para la evangelización, por lo que animó a muchos a través de su oración y sus escritos.
- ◆ Siervo de Dios Antonio Cuipa y compañeros, mártires de La Florida: Nativos americanos y misioneros que acogieron la fe y dieron su vida por ella, aquí mismo, en lo que hoy es nuestra diócesis. "La sangre de los mártires es la semilla de la Iglesia" (Tertuliano, siglo II).
- ◆ Sierva de Dios Hna. Thea Bowman (Jackson, MS): Convertida al catolicismo y religiosa, se dedicó a compartir la alegría del Evangelio, especialmente con sus hermanas y hermanos afroamericanos. Trabajó por la unidad racial e inspiró a millones de personas a aceptar la fe y a vivirla correctamente.
- ◆ San Andrés Dũng-Lac y los mártires vietnamitas: Ciento diecisiete misioneros, catequistas, clérigos y laicos que murieron por la fe en Vietnam.
- ◆ San José: Fiel padre (terrenal) de Jesús y esposo de María. En este Año de San José, invocamos a este gran santo para que nos inspire a llevar el Evangelio a todas las naciones.
- ◆ María, la Madre de Dios: Después de recibir la noticia de la encarnación por parte del ángel Gabriel, María se apresuró a visitar a su prima Isabel y a compartir la buena nueva de la salvación. Siguió fielmente a Jesús, compartió su sufrimiento, se regocijó en su resurrección, y recibió el Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés con los apóstoles. Quizá sus palabras en las Bodas de Caná sean las más apropiadas para nosotros hoy: "Hagan lo que Él les diga" (Jn 2,5).

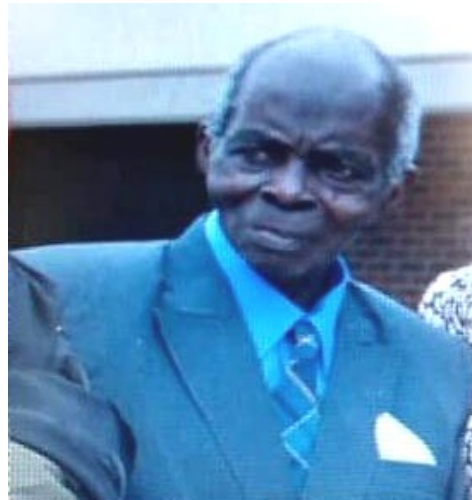
