Mr. Delaitre will do a presentation on Civil Rights activists Robert and Trudie Perkins

Delaitre Hollinger is the President and CEO of the National Association for the Preservation of African-American History and Culture, Inc. (NAPAAHC) He is a past president of the Tallahassee Branch NAACP and currently serves as an at-large member of the Executive Committee. Hollinger serves as Director and Exhibitions Curator for the Taylor House Museum of Historic Frenchtown and is the former Curator for the Wells' Built Museum of African American History and Culture. In 2016, Hollinger was District Legislative Aide in the Florida Senate for Geraldine Thompson. In August 2018, he was inducted into the NAACP Civil Rights Hall of Fame during the organization's 38th Annual Freedom Fund Banquet.



Through his active involvement in civic affairs, Hollinger as President of the NAPAAHC, has been responsible for various historic preservation projects, the renaming of public facilities and the erection of public monuments and memorials. These include:

- ◆ Naming and dedication of C.K. Steele Memorial Highway
- ◆ Renaming of Gamble Street to Robert and Trudie Perkins Way
- ◆ Renaming of Chapman Pond to the Dr. Charles L. Evans Pond Park
- ◆ Discovery and subsequent design of a memorial to formerly Enslaved Persons on the Houstoun Plantation at Capital City Country Club
- ◆ The Erection of a Monument and Civil Rights Memorial Plaza in Tallahassee's Cascades Park.

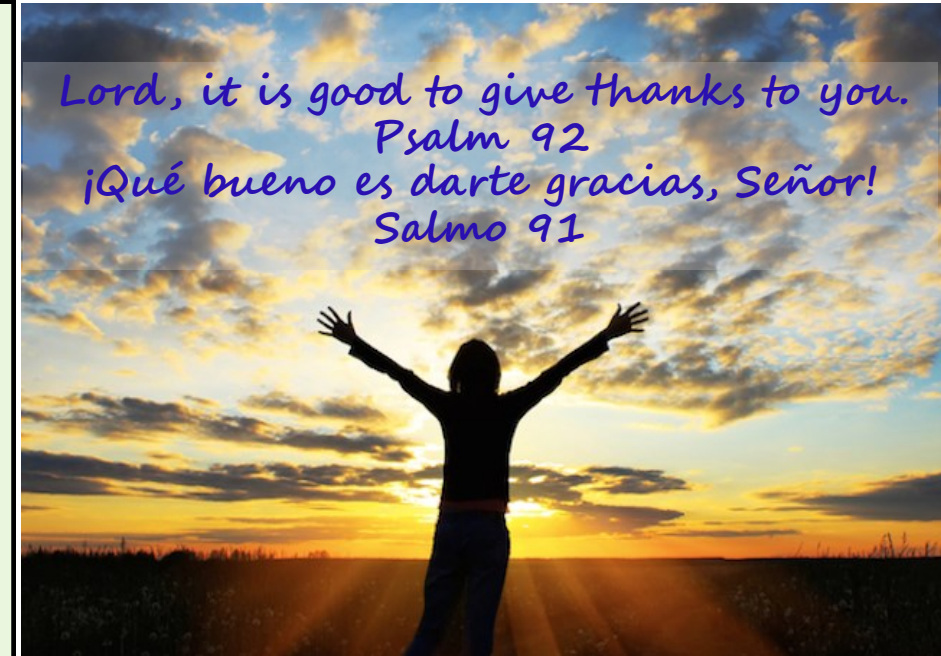

From the Pastor's Desk...

Sunday, February 27, 2022 – Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle C

Readings: Sirach 27:4-7, Psalm 92 “Lord, it is good to give thanks to you”, 1 Corinthians 15:54-58, Luke 6:39-45

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this is the last Sunday in the Black History Month. This celebration is not just an acknowledgement of the past struggle for freedom, but also commitment to the future; remembering the past, celebrating the present, and a commitment in building a better future. Black history is American history. Understanding past barriers to progress for marginalized individuals, specifically people of color helps us better recognize systems that still produce discriminatory practices and disparate outcomes. Knowing Black History not only helps us recognize these systems, it also makes clear that these systems affect more than just the marginalized and people of color. Systems of racism and oppression hurt us all. This year, Black History Month's theme is "Black Health and Wellness." We remind ourselves to take good care of our physical, emotional, spiritual and psychological well being. So that we can all 'Lift every our voice and sing till earth and heaven ring'. We also expressed our gratitude to the organizers of this year's celebration in our parish.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, which begins Lent. A time for us to renew our lives. At the beginning of Lent the Church sets before us Jesus' reflections on the three great cardinal works of the spiritual life: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We are invited to become involved in all three. There is prayer to beg from God the force to convert and to believe the Gospel. Fight against evil was next: this is an essential part of Christian life in order to keep passions and selfishness under control. Lastly, fast: evil cannot be won without self-denial, or without giving up one's likings. We should share the most precious gifts we have received: love, compassion, understanding and forgiveness.

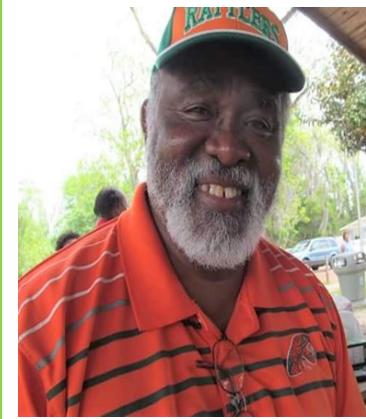
When we receive the ashes on Wednesday we shall hear the words again “Repent and believe in the Gospel”. May the Lord bless us.

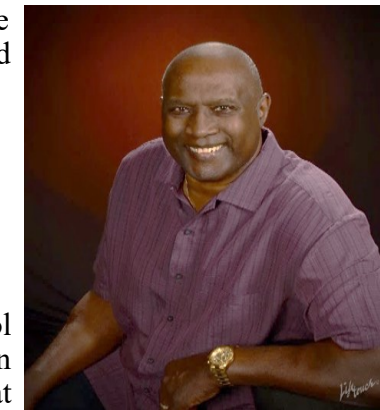
Celebrating St. Eugene's Heroes and Sheroes

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, este es el último domingo del Mes de la Historia de la Raza Negra.
